March 4, 2022 Subject: OCC Response to Request for Supervisory Non-Objection to Hold Stablecoin Reserve Deposits Dear This letter responds to correspondence received by the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) on January 6, 2022, on behalf of requesting the OCC's non-objection pursuant to OCC Interpretive Letter #1179, dated November 18, 2021. In requested supervisory non-objection to hold customer that correspondence, deposits that serve as reserves for stablecoins, as covered by OCC Interpretive Letter #1172, dated September 21, 2020. To date, the documentation provided does not reflect sufficient due diligence commensurate with the risks associated with the proposed activity. As such, the OCC is unable to provide a non-objection at this time. A subsequent non-objection request submission by must sufficiently address the pertinent aspects of Interpretive Letter #1172 and, as detailed in OCC Interpretive Letter #1179, should demonstrate that it has established appropriate risk management and measurement processes for the proposed activity. These processes must include having adequate systems in place to identify, measure, monitor, and control the risks of the proposed activity on an ongoing basis. To meet this standard, due diligence and supervisory nonobjection request must, at a minimum,
